Bio: Thomas Barfield is a social anthropologist with ethnographic fieldwork experience among pastoral nomads in northern Afghanistan in the mid 1970s and field research on law, government and economy in post-2001 Afghanistan. He has also conducted short periods of research in Xinjiang, China and post-Soviet Central Asia. Barfield is the author of *The Central Asian Arabs of Afghanistan* (1981), *The Perilous Frontier: Nomadic Empires and China* (1989) and *Afghanistan: An Atlas of Indigenous Domestic Architecture* (1991). In 2006 he was awarded a Guggenheim Fellowship leading to the publication of *Afghanistan: A Cultural and Political History* (2010, 2023), winner of Outstanding Title Award of the *American Library Association*. He is a Professor of Anthropology at Boston University and since 2005 has served as President of the *American Institute for Afghanistan Studies*.
